First Light - Script Award Scheme

Deadline: 13 October 2009

First Light enables young people to realise their potential through digital film and media projects. It is currently open to applications for its Script Award Scheme, to support partnerships between script professionals and young people to inspire and aid the development of short film scripts. Funding of up to £3,000 is available for:

- projects where young people aged 5 to 19 take creative control of the idea development process;
- · projects that create scripts in any genre;
- projects that result in film scripts of up to 10 minutes in length;
- projects based in the UK, primarily involving young people who live in this country.

Ten per cent match funding is required. First Light Movies are particularly encouraging applications from East of England, East Midlands, North East, Northern Ireland, North West, Scotland, Wales, West Midlands and Yorkshire and the Humber. - Be an original piece of new music, yet to be created
- · Be ambitious, inspiring, creative and of the highest possible quality
- Challenge the boundaries of musical performance in the UK today
- Have at least one guaranteed live public performance in the UK
- Have the potential to create a lasting musical impact and reach a significant number of people
- Be created by music creator/s (e.g. composers/songwriters/producers) living and working in the UK.

Austin and Hope Pilkington Trust Grants Making Programme

The Austin and Hope Pilkington Trust awards grants to charitable organisations in the United Kingdom and overseas. The trustees welcome applications for projects within the following areas for the next three years. These categories are then repeated in a three-year rotation.

The annual categories include:

- 2009 Community & Disability (Deadline for applications: 1st Nov 2009)
- 2010 Children, Youth, The Elderly and Medical (Deadline for applications:1st June & 1st Nov 2010)
- 2011 Music and the Arts and Overseas (Deadline for applications:1st June & 1st Nov 2011)

Please note that, for 2010, only Medical Research projects dealing with the ageing population will be considered. The other priorities - Children, Youth and the Elderly - as well as other non-research based medical work are still welcome. If your charity's work falls within one of these categories and would like to be considered for a grant, please submit an application by 1st June or 1st November only in the appropriate year. Grants are usually between £1,000 and £10,000, with the majority being £5,000 or less. Exceptionally, grants of up to £20,000 are made, but these are usually for medical research projects. Reaching Communities Programme (England)

The BIG Lottery Fund has announced that in response to the current economic crisis it is increasing the budget for its Reaching Communities programme in 2009 – 10 by £20 million to £80 million. Reaching Communities provides grants of between £10,000 and £500,000 to support projects that help people and communities who are most in need, and can really make a difference. This increase in funding is designed to act as a 'bridge' between BIG's current funding programmes and BIG's new Open Funding stream which will go live in 2010. Projects funded through Reaching Communities can be new or existing activities, or be the core work of an organisation. The programme is open to registered charities, charitable or not for profit companies, statutory bodies, schools and social enterprises.
