Weather permitting, we normally plan a walk beforehand for anyone who would like to join in. Do bring a flask of tea and perhaps a biscuit or two for refreshment afterwards.

We plan to know the songs by heart and to ask members to do some preparation beforehand to reduce the 'learning from new' element. A folder will be given to you with sheet music and teaching cds when you pay your first quarter's subscription. (When you feel you know a song well enough, and in your own time, we ask that you consider returning the sheet music and/or the cd so that it may be handed on. More will be issued as we add to our repertoire. To meet the costs of producing and sustaining the folders, the joiner's fee is £25 for three sessions. Thereafter the fee is £20 per quarter. In order to nurture the spiritual aspirations of the group, we encourage people to be committed to attending as regularly as possible.

We shall donate one tenth of the income of the group either to the venues that we use or to other charities.

of AURORA 2009 on Sunday 8 November.

If you would like your work to be considered for inclusion in this screening, please send any new moving image work to OUTPOST by Friday 16th October. The final selection will be made by Adam Pugh, Director of AURORA and the OUTPOST steering committee.

AURORA is a festival based in Norwich which focuses on the moving image in the most diffuse sense. This year, for its last ever edition, the festival will run from 5 - 15 November at Norwich Arts Centre, and other venues across the city.

For 2009, the festival theme is 'Common Ground'. Straying from anthropological and ethnographic studies to oblique explorations of myth and the representation of reality, the theme leads to an entirely literal reading of the 'common ground' in which ecology collides with social history and direct action.

As part of the festival, OUTPOST and AURORA have invited Ultra-red & the Rural Racism Project for the November exhibition (2 – 21st) at OUTPOST. This sound-based project will be activated by a public event on Tuesday 10 November at 5pm. Throughout November, OUTPOST will also host a two-day 16mm film workshop by Tom Lock (Sunday 1 & Sunday 8 November); a talk by artist activist John Jordan on (Monday 9th) and a workshop and screening by Berlin-based artist Milena Gierke (Wednesday 11th).

Artists' groups and networks within the UK can apply for awards of up to £500 through the Go & See bursaries scheme. The scheme which is provided by a-n The Artists Information Company and managed by the Networking Artist's Network aims to support exchange between artists' groups and networks in the UK and beyond in order to explore new projects and provide a focus for critical exchange. NAN defines artists' groups as two or more artists working together or engaged in collective activity who consider themselves to be a group or network.

There are a number of application deadlines throughout the year. The next deadline for applications is 6pm on the 1st December 2009.
