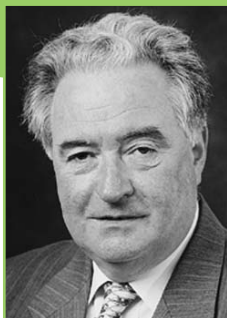

It has everything you need to know if you are applying, or thinking of applying, for a place for your child at a primary school in Norfolk. It also has information about special schools, but not about independent schools.

We work very hard in Norfolk to make sure that children get the best possible educational opportunities to equip them well for life, whichever school they attend.

The vast majority of parents send their children to their local school and are pleased with the education they get. You can, however, apply for your child to go to any school, although this doesn't guarantee that he or she will get a place. Some schools fill up very quickly and have a set of priorities to decide who gets in. There are also different types of school, and different rules apply to how the admission of children works. To help you find your way through this system, we have a list of frequently asked questions (with answers!) on page 71.

We have listed every primary school, and special school, in Norfolk, as well as other useful information. You can also get a prospectus from each school, which contains all the basic information you need about a school. If you need more information or help, please get in touch with us. Contact details are on page 3.

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Early education

What is early education?

All four-year-old children are eligible for a funded early education place of five sessions lasting two and half-hours each per week, for a minimum of thirty-three weeks each year. Many three-year olds are also eligible for a funded early education place.

By April 2004, all three-year old children will be eligible for a funded early education place from the beginning of the term following their third birthday.

Where may my child access early education?

Early education may be provided in playgroups, private day nurseries, independent schools and maintained nursery classes and nursery schools.

Nursery schools and schools with nursery classes are listed at the back of this section.

Playgroups or pre-school groups

Playgroups or pre-school groups are run by private or voluntary organisations which provide five two and a half hour sessions of early education each week, for a minimum of thirty-three weeks each year. These groups will be following the foundation stage curriculum. For eligible children funding will be through the early education funding.

Day-care centres or day nurseries

Day-care centres or day nurseries (sometimes named nursery schools) are run by private or non-profit-making groups and provide childcare throughout the day, usually from 8.00am until 6.00 p.m. Early education may form part of this childcare, in which case the group will be following

the foundation stage curriculum. For children eligible for early education funding, fees may be reduced for five sessions of two and a half hours weekly for at least thirty-three weeks each year, by the amount of the early education funding.

Independent Schools

Independent schools may provide early education at a pre-prep or prep school and will be following the foundation stage curriculum. Eligible children may be funded for five sessions of two and half-hours weekly for at least thirty-three weeks each year, by the amount of the early education funding.

Maintained nursery classes

Some schools have nursery classes on the same site, which are maintained by Norfolk County Council as the Authority. Each nursery class follows the foundation stage curriculum and will provide five two and half-hour sessions of early education each week, during term time.

The Authority funds places at nursery classes.

Maintained nursery schools

There are three nursery schools in Norfolk, which are maintained by the Authority. Each nursery school follows the foundation stage curriculum and will provide five two and a half-hour sessions of early education each week, during term-time. The Authority funds places at nursery schools. One nursery school is also an early excellence centre and another will become a neighbourhood nursery.

Early years centres, children's centres, neighbourhood nurseries

New centres providing a combination of early education, childcare and family services are being developed in Norfolk. These may be maintained by the Authority, or run by private, nonprofit-making or voluntary groups. These centres will provide childcare, from 0-5 years throughout the day, usually from 8.00am until 6.00 p.m., together with other child and family services. Early education will form part of this childcare for eligible children and the centres will be following the foundation stage curriculum. For children eligible for early education funding, fees may be reduced for five sessions of two and a half hours weekly for at least thirty-three weeks each year, by the amount of the early education funding.

Admission to nursery classes and schools

Admission to community and voluntary controlled nursery classes and schools

Children may be admitted into nursery classes or nursery schools at the beginning of the term following their third birthday, if a place is available. Children usually start nursery class at the beginning of term in September, January or April. However, for children moving into the area, where a place is available, children may start mid-term. Nursery provision is limited and a certain proportion of places is reserved for children with special educational needs. If you wish to seek a place for your child in one of the Authority's nurseries or nursery classes you should contact the school direct.

It is important that you register your interest with the school by 19 March 2004.

If you are given a place in the nursery class, that does not mean your child will automatically have an admission place in the Reception Year in that school. Parents will be required to express a preference for a place at their preferred school and the oversubscription rules for first admission will then apply.

Oversubscription rules for admission to nursery classes at community and voluntary controlled schools

If there are more applications for places than there are places available, the Authority will give preference to children living **nearest** to the school according to the following rules in this order of priority:

- 1** children with independently verified evidence of additional need
- 2** children in public care who live in the area served by the school
- 3** children who live within the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of their admission
- 4** children who live within the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the adjoining middle/junior school
- 5** children who live within the catchment area and have no brother or sister connection with that or the adjoining middle/junior school
- 6** children who live outside the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of their admission
- 7** children who live outside the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the adjoining middle/junior school
- 8** children who live outside the catchment area and have no brother or sister connection with that or the adjoining middle/junior school.

Important note:

“School” is defined as the main school and not a learning support centre attached to the school. This means that no priority would be given to an out-of-area child who had either a brother or sister in temporary or part-time attendance at the attached learning support centre. The address provided to the school will be used to determine the catchment school. We will accept changes to the address up to the closing date of 19th March 2004. To determine who lives nearest, distance will be measured door to door using Ordnance Survey data.

Adjoining junior/middle school - this only applies when the 2 schools share the same site.

Oversubscription rules for first admission to foundation and voluntary aided schools

You will find the oversubscription rules for each foundation or voluntary aided school, which are set by the governing body of the school, included in the lists of schools.

Primary education

Primary schools in Norfolk

Your child's primary education will take place in one of the following kinds of school depending on where you live:

Infant school for 5 to 7 year olds

First school for 5 to 8 year olds or 5 to 9 year olds

Primary school for 5 to 11 year olds

First & middle school for 5 to 12 year olds

Junior school for 7 to 11 year olds or 8 to 11 year olds

Middle school for 8 to 12 year olds.

When do pupils transfer from one school to another?

Pupils transfer from infant schools to junior schools in the year after their 7th birthday (7+) and from first schools to middle or junior schools in the year after their 8th birthday (8+). In a small number of cases on the Norfolk/Suffolk border pupils transfer to middle schools in the year after their 9th birthday (9+).

Pupils transfer to secondary education from primary schools or junior schools at 11+ and from middle schools at 12+.

Types of school

Norfolk County Council as Local Education Authority maintains various types of school as detailed below. The Authority does not offer places at independent schools. Places may however occasionally be approved at independent special schools where this is identified through the statementing process.

Community schools. These schools are owned and run by the Authority. Religious education and worship is taught in accordance with Norfolk's agreed syllabus.

Voluntary controlled schools. These schools were originally provided by voluntary organisations such as the Church of England and educational trusts. In most voluntary controlled schools, religious education is provided in accordance with Norfolk's agreed syllabus.

Voluntary aided schools. The governors decide what religious education is taught but it must be in accordance with the trust deed of the school. The governors also have additional powers and responsibilities for the appointment of staff, admission of pupils and the upkeep and improvement of buildings.

Foundation schools. Most former grant-maintained schools have now become foundation schools. The Authority is responsible for funding these schools but their governors are responsible for running them and specifically responsible for the admission of pupils.

Community special schools. These are for children with specific learning requirements who are unable to attend a mainstream school.

How schools are managed

Schools are managed by their governors and headteacher, with support and guidance from the Authority. First admission to primary, first and infant schools

By law, children must start statutory education full time at the beginning of the term following their fifth birthday. Where admission is offered before compulsory school age, parents may delay their child's entry into school until later in that academic year.

When do children start school in Norfolk? In community and voluntary controlled schools children born between 1 September 1999 and the end of February 2000 may start school full-time no earlier than the beginning of the autumn term before their fifth birthday. Children born between the 1 March 2000 and 31 August 2000, may start school part-time no earlier than the beginning of the autumn term before their fifth birthday and full-time at the beginning of the spring term before their fifth birthday.

This policy has also been strongly

recommended for adoption by voluntary aided and foundation Schools **but** you must check the actual admission arrangements for these schools as detailed in the school lists.

What does part-time mean? Schools may offer five part-time sessions a week of at least two and a half hours in either mornings, afternoons or a mixture of both. Parents will need to check the arrangements with individual schools.

Can my child start school later? Our admissions policy allows children to start school earlier than the law requires. The law also allows parents to ask for their child to be admitted but lets them delay the start date until later in the school year. The effect of this is that the place is held and cannot be offered to another child.

However, by law your child must start school by their compulsory school age (by

the term after their fifth birthday) so admission cannot be deferred after this date. Parents can only delay the admission until later in the academic year (so admission must take place before the end of the summer term).

When must I decide which school I would prefer my child to attend? For community and voluntary controlled schools it is important that you register your preference with the school by **19 March 2004**.

If your application arrives after the closing date it will be given a lower priority than all preferences received by the closing date for the initial offer of places. This is because all applications received by the closing date must be considered before any late applications.

Foundation and voluntary aided schools may set a different date so you must check the closing date with the school.

Which school should my child attend? Most admission rules give highest priority for local children living within the catchment area for the school. However, provided you tell us which school you would like your child to go to (your preference), we have to offer you a place there unless the school is full and other children have higher priority. You will be responsible for providing any transport that may be necessary if your preference is not for your catchment school.

Can I state a preference for more than one school? In Norfolk you can only apply for one school place. If you express a preference for more than one school, your applications will cancel each other out. We will have to contact you to check which is your top school and you may be too late to get the school you want.

What happens if a school gets too many applications? When there are not enough places at a school for all the children who have applied, we use oversubscription rules to decide who will get in. These are published on page 20 for community and voluntary controlled schools and as part of the school information for foundation and voluntary aided schools. You need to consider these rules to determine what priority your child will have for a place.

At which school do I stand the best chance of getting a place? Most schools give highest priority to parents living within the catchment area for the school. In making your preference, you must consider the types of school (i.e. primary school, infant school or first school) in the area where you live. If you consider a school outside your catchment area, your child will not be guaranteed a place at the next school in that area when it is time for them to transfer.

Can I reserve a place at my catchment school and state a preference for a different school? Admission authorities cannot reserve places. If your catchment school is popular and you decide to apply for another popular school and are not offered a place there, you may find that your catchment school is also full and we will not be able to offer you a place at either.

Does this decision affect which high school my child will attend? If your child attends a primary school that is not your local school, they will not automatically transfer to the high school for that area (because most high schools also give priority to local children).

Is there a limit to the number of children in a class? In Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 (children aged 4, 5 and 6) children should normally be taught in classes of no more than 30.

Who do you define as a brother or sister? When we use oversubscription rules 'brother' or 'sister' means: brothers or sisters living at the same address including adopted children, step-brothers, stepsisters and children in foster care within a family unit.

What happens if parents live at separate addresses? Where a child lives with separated parents who have shared responsibility, each for part of the week, the home address will be considered to be the address that the child lives at for most of the week (including weekends). We will expect evidence to support this at the time of application. In cases where the child spends an equal proportion of the week with both parents evidence of the main contact address and which parent receives the child benefit will be required to support the application.

Will my child be interviewed? Schools may wish to meet with parents before admission to discuss particular needs and issues for your child but this must not in any way be used to consider whether the child is offered a place or not.

Will I be offered help with transport? We will offer your child free transport to their catchment school if it is more than two miles away but this increases to more than three miles if your child is over 8. See section 3 for full details about school transport in Norfolk. Free transport will not be provided where parents express a preference for a school which is not the catchment or nearest school to their address.

My child has special needs, will this affect the decision? Children with special needs, but without a statement of special educational needs have to be treated the same as all other applicants. This means

they cannot be turned down for a place just because a school thinks it cannot cater for those needs. Where a child has a statement of special educational needs your family will have been consulted by the Authority on the particular needs and the provision (including a named school where appropriate) that will be made to meet these needs. Once a school is named in a statement, the school has to admit the child.

What if I move house after I have applied for a school place? If you move after you have stated your preference, you must inform us. If it is after the closing date it may not always be possible to get a place at the local school for your new address. Let us know as soon as possible when you may think you will be moving. You will need to provide evidence of the new address.

When will I know if my child has a place? We will tell you if your child has a place at your preferred school by early May 2004.

What can I do if I am refused a place? If you are unable to get a place for your child at the school you want, you will be offered an alternative place. You will also be given the opportunity to appeal (see page 73). Appeals will be held as early as possible in the second half of the summer term.

We will also keep a list until the end of summer term, of children applying for all community and voluntary controlled schools. If any places become available, all those who have expressed a preference for a place at that school will be considered, including those that have applied after the closing date of 19 March, 2004. We will use the oversubscription rules to decide who can be offered the place.

Is there any further information to help me decide? The lists of schools shows how many pupils schools can take. The school will be able to advise you if they were oversubscribed last year. The Authority will also give you further advice to help you make your preference. We will do our best to tell parents if a school is likely to be oversubscribed before March 2004. However as parents can apply up to the closing date, this can only be an indicator of possible oversubscription. Details on admissions and other matters are in individual school brochures, available from each school.

Admissions policy

The Authority decides on the admissions policy for all schools except foundation and voluntary aided schools which set their own. You can find out the category of each school in the schools list.

Oversubscription rules for first admission to community and voluntary controlled schools

If there are more applications for places than there are places available, the Authority will give preference to children living nearest to the school, according to the following rules in this order of priority:

- 1** children with a statement of special educational needs naming that school
- 2** children in public care who live in the area served by the school
- 3** children who live within the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of their admission.
- 4** children who live within the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the adjoining middle/junior school
- 5** children who live within the catchment area and have no brother or sister connection with that or the adjoining middle/junior school

6 children who live outside the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of their admission

7 children who live outside the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the adjoining middle/junior school

8 children who live outside the catchment area and have no brother or sister connection with that or the adjoining middle/junior school.

Important note:

"School" is defined as the main school and not a learning support centre or nursery class attached to the school. This means that no priority would be given to a child from outside the catchment area who had either a brother or sister at the attached nursery class or in temporary or part-time attendance at the attached learning support centre. The address given to the school will be used to decide the catchment school. We will accept changes to the address up to the closing date of 19 March 2004. To determine who lives nearest, we will measure distance door to door using Ordnance Survey data.

Adjoining junior/middle school - this only applies when the two schools share the same site.

Oversubscription rules for first admission to foundation and voluntary aided schools

You will find the oversubscription rules for each foundation or voluntary aided school, which are set by the governing body of the school, included in the lists of schools.

Transfers to junior/ middle schools

When do children transfer to junior/middle schools in Norfolk? If your child attends an infant school he or she will transfer to a junior school at age 7+. If your child attends a first school he or she will transfer to a junior or middle school at age 8+, or in some areas at 9+.

When must I decide which school I would prefer my child to attend? In January 2004 we will write to all parents of children in Norfolk infant and first schools who are due to transfer to tell you which junior or middle school serves your area. You will be asked to confirm your preference for this school or express a preference for an alternative school. For community or voluntary controlled schools you must complete and return your preference form to your current school by **14 February 2004**.

If your application arrives after the closing date, it will be given a lower priority than all preferences received by the closing date for the initial offer of places.

This is because all applications received by the closing date must be considered before any late applications.

Foundation and voluntary aided schools may set a different date so you must check the closing date with the school.

Which school should my child attend? Most admission rules give highest priority for local children living within the catchment area for the school. However, if you tell us which school you would like your child to go to (your preference), we have to offer you a place there unless the school is full and other children have

higher priority. You will be responsible for providing any transport needed if your preference is not for your catchment school.

Can I state a preference for more than one school? In Norfolk you can only apply for one school place. If you express a preference for more than one school, your applications will cancel each other out. We will have to contact you to check which is your top school and you may be too late to get the school you want.

What happens if a school gets too many applications? When there are not enough places at a school for all the children who have applied, we use oversubscription rules to decide who will get in. These are published on page 61 for community and voluntary controlled schools and as part of the school information for foundation and voluntary aided schools. You need to consider these rules to determine what priority your child will have for a place.

At which school do I stand the best chance of getting a place? Most schools give highest priority to parents living within the catchment area for the school. In making your preference, you must consider the types of school (i.e. primary school, junior school or middle school) in the area where you live. If you consider a school outside your catchment area, your child will not be guaranteed a place at the next school in that area when your child comes to transfer.

Can I reserve a place at my catchment school and state a preference for a different school? Admission authorities cannot reserve places. If your catchment school is popular and you decide to apply for another popular school and are not offered a place there you may find that your catchment school is also full and we will not be able to offer you a place at either.

Does this decision affect which high school my child will attend? If your child attends a junior or middle school that is not your local school, they will not automatically transfer to the high school for that area (because most high schools also give priority to local children).

Is there a limit to the number of children in a class? There is no legal limit for children attending junior or middle schools. However it is important that classes are not too large so that pupils get an effective education.

Who do you define as a brother or sister? When we use the oversubscription rules 'brother' or 'sister' means: brothers or sisters living at the same address including adopted children, stepbrothers, stepsisters and children in foster care within a family unit.

What happens if parents live at separate addresses? Where a child lives with separated parents who have shared responsibility, each for part of the week, the home address will be considered to be the address that the child lives at for most of the week (including weekends). We will expect evidence to support this at the time of application. In cases where the child spends an equal proportion of the week with both parents evidence of the main contact address and which parent receives the child benefit will be required to support the application.

Will my child be interviewed? Schools may wish to meet with parents before admission to discuss particular needs and issues for your child but this must not in any way be used to consider whether your child is offered a place or not.

Will I be offered help with transport? We will offer your child free transport to their catchment school if it is more than three miles away or more than two miles if your child is under 8. See section 3 for full details about school transport in Norfolk. Free transport will not be provided where parents express a preference for a school which is not the catchment or nearest school to their address.

My child has special needs, will this affect the decision? Children with special needs, but without a statement of special educational needs have to be treated the same as all other applicants. This means they cannot be turned down for a place just because a school thinks it cannot cater for those needs. Where a child has a statement of special educational needs your family will have been consulted by the Authority on the particular needs and the provision (including a named school where appropriate) that will be made to meet these needs. Once a school is named in a statement, the school has to admit the child.

What if I move house after I have applied for a school place? If you move after you have stated your preference you must inform us. If it is after the closing date it may not always be possible to get a place at the local school for your new address. Let us know as soon as possible when you may think you will be moving. You will need to provide evidence of the new address.

When will I know if my child has a place? We will tell you if your child has a place at your preferred school by mid March 2004.

What can I do if I am refused a place? If you are unable to get a place for your child at the school you want, you will be offered an alternative place. You will also be given the opportunity to appeal (see page 73). Appeals will be held as early as possible in the second half of the summer term.

Is there any further information to help me decide? The school lists show how many pupils schools can take. The school will be able to advise you if they were oversubscribed last year. The Authority will also give you further advice to help you make your preference. Details of admissions and other matters are also in individual school brochures, available from each school.

Oversubscription rules for community and voluntary controlled junior/middle schools If there are more applications for places at the school than there are places available, the Authority will give preference to children living nearest to the school according to the following rules in this order of priority:

1 children with a statement of special educational needs naming that school

2 children in public care who live in the area served by the school

3 children who live within the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of their admission

4 children who live within the catchment area and have no brother or sister connection with the school

5 children who live outside the catchment area and have a brother or sister attending the school at the time of their admission

6 children who live outside the catchment area and have no brother or sister connection with the school.

Important note:

“School” is defined as the main school and not a learning support centre or nursery class attached to the school. This means that no greater priority would be given to a child from outside the catchment area who had either a brother or sister at the attached nursery class or in temporary or part-time attendance at the attached learning support centre. The address given on the preference form will be used to decide the catchment school. We will accept changes to the address up to the closing date of 14th February 2004. To determine who lives nearest, we will measure distance door to door using Ordnance Survey data.

Oversubscription rules for foundation and voluntary aided junior/middle schools You will find the oversubscription rules for each foundation or voluntary aided school, which are set by the governing body of the school, included in the school information.

What if I prefer a school outside

Norfolk? If you wish to apply for a place at a school run by another Local Education Authority, you should apply to that Authority or contact the headteacher of the school direct. Your child will usually be admitted if the school has enough room in the appropriate year group but you must accept responsibility for transport and the cost incurred. In some cases, we have an arrangement to allow children to be admitted to specific schools in neighbouring counties. In these cases, transport will be provided for children who live outside the Norfolk walking distance (see page 74). See page 4 for contact details for neighbouring LEAs.

What happens if I move to a different

part of Norfolk? If you move home and a change of school is necessary, your child will be given a place at the local school, provided there is room in the appropriate year group. You should contact the headteacher of the school you wish your child to attend, or your local Education Advice Centre (see page 3), **before you move**. If you are unable to get a place at the catchment school, we will provide transport free of charge to the next nearest school with a place available, provided the school is outside the appropriate walking distance (see page 74).

If you move home but wish your child to remain at his or her existing school and this is no longer your catchment school, you would normally meet the costs of transport from home to school. To find out if there is any transport to meet your needs, telephone (01603) 223800.

What should parents moving to Norfolk

do? You can contact the Education Advice Centre for your area (see page 3) to find out which schools are available and which is the local school for your new address. You should then contact the headteacher of that school - and any others you wish to consider - and ask to visit. Admission to a school other than the local one will be agreed if the school suits your child's needs, has enough room in the appropriate year group and if you agree to meet the cost of travelling.

What about other transfers? In the unlikely situation that you want your child to move schools at a time other than the standard time for transfer, you should discuss the matter with the headteacher of your child's current school first. If, after these discussions, you still wish your child to move, contact the headteacher of your preferred school to see if a place is available. You should not take your child out of school before you have found a place at another school and checked what the transport arrangements would be. For advice about alternative places please contact the appropriate Education Advice Centre (see page 3). We expect transfers to take place at the beginning of term. We also expect children attending middle schools to transfer to secondary education when they are 12, and not at 11.

What happens if I request admission to a school outside the normal age group for my child?

Pupils are expected to start and progress through school in the appropriate year group for their age. If you request a place

in another year group you will be required to forward details to the admission authority for that school to support your application. The admission authority will consider whether there are exceptional reasons for supporting the request in which case your child will be considered against the oversubscription rules for the school. If a place is refused parents will be offered a statutory right of appeal against the refusal.

Transfer to secondary school

If your child is due to transfer to secondary school in September 2004 you should refer to our 'Parents' Guide to Secondary Schools in Norfolk'.

The right of appeal

Parental preference and the right of appeal

The admission authority cannot offer a place in the local catchment school if parents do not express a preference in writing for the school. A place cannot be reserved at the catchment school if you express a preference for another school and do not get a place. When the admission authority is unable to give your child a place at the school of your preference, your local Education Advice Centre (see page 3) will be happy to advise you about an alternative school. If your preference for first admission or transfer to junior/middle school is refused, you have the right of appeal. Appeals are heard by the Schools Admission Appeals Panel, which acts independently of the Authority. Parents may appear before the Panel and may be accompanied by a friend or someone can go on their behalf. The decision of the Appeals Panel will be given to parents in writing, along with the reasons for this decision. The decision is final and binding upon the Authority and parents. In the case of a child who is due to start school at the age of five, appeals will normally be considered in the term before the beginning of the school year.

Infant class appeals

If you are seeking a place for a 5, 6, or 7 year old, you may have a more limited right of appeal. This will happen when the year group is full and the class already has 30 children in it. This is because the law states that infants (5, 6, and 7 year olds) should not be taught in classes with more than 30 children in them.

In these cases appeal panels can only allow your appeal if the admission rule was not applied correctly and your child should have been offered a place, or the decision to refuse your child a place was not one which a reasonable admission authority would make in that situation.

School transport

Home to school transport

The authority provides free transport in certain circumstances and may be able to help towards transport costs in other circumstances.

Full details of the transport policy are available at all Norfolk schools, and Education Advice Centres (see page 3). It is also on the Passenger Transport Unit (PTU) website www.passengertransport.norfolk.gov.uk

For transport purposes, Norfolk pupils of statutory school age (5-16) are allocated a school, determined by their home address, for each stage of their education. This is called the **catchment** school.

How we decide who is entitled to free transport

Applications for transport are considered individually, taking into account the relevant legal requirements and the circumstances.

We generally provide free transport for children of compulsory school age (5-16) who either:

- attend the catchment school or;
- attend the school nearest to home able to offer them a place;

if they are:

- children under 8 living more than two miles from school, measured by the nearest available walking route;

or:

- children of 8 and over living more than three miles from school, measured by the nearest available walking route;

The ages are taken on 1 September in each school year.

Transport will also be provided if a statement of special educational needs indicates that specific transport should be provided for the individual pupil to ensure that they can attend school.

If you do not qualify for free transport

We may be able to help pupils and students who do not qualify under our general policy for free transport in certain circumstances such as:

- when moving home in the last term of primary school;
- when moving home in Years 10 or 11 of high school;
- when there are safety factors relating to the route.

If a child lives more than two miles from the local school, free transport will be provided on admission from 1 September, for children born between 1 September 1998 and 31 August 1999. Children born between 1 March 1999 and 31 August 1999 will be offered a place at school in the autumn term on a part-time basis. However, they will not be normally provided with a mid-day journey. Free transport is not provided for other younger children admitted to school early.

If you have concerns about your child's eligibility for free school transport contact the Passenger Transport Unit on (01603) 223800.

Discretionary travel scheme

Some help can also be given with transport to those not entitled under the general policy, if there are spare seats available on existing school buses, for example to those who are:

- living within the qualifying distance of two or three miles;
- attending a church school on denominational grounds;
- not attending their local or nearest school.

Parents have to contribute towards the costs, although there are some exemptions in certain circumstances for people receiving certain benefits.

Transport help if the local school is full

If the catchment or nearest school is full, transport will be provided in accordance with the general policy to an alternative school. Please contact your local Education Advice Centre (see page 3) to confirm if the local school is full and if so, which is the next appropriate school to attend.

What help is provided with transport?

For pupils entitled to free transport, we arrange transport on local bus services, rail services or contracted vehicles. In exceptional circumstances, grants are paid and parents use their own transport.

How do I apply for transport for my child? You will need to complete an application form, available from the School or the Passenger Transport Unit on (01603) 223800. You can also print it off our website - www.passengertransport.norfolk.gov.uk

The completed form should be returned to the Passenger Transport Unit as soon as possible as no refunds are made for transport costs incurred before the date of

receipt of the application form or whilst it is being processed. If your child is eligible for free transport you do not have to re-apply until the next stage of education e.g. first to middle school.

I do not live in Norfolk but my child goes to a school in Norfolk. Can I get any help with transport? If you do not live in Norfolk, you must contact the Local Education Authority for the area in which you live for help.

Safety

We will specify the transport arrangements and appropriate pick-up points for each route and will take all reasonable precautions to ensure the safety of pupils on their journeys to and from school. For their part, children are expected to behave whilst travelling and to observe the Code of Conduct.

Parents are responsible for getting their child to and from the nearest pick-up point and are reminded that their child's safety is solely their responsibility at all times before they board the vehicle for the journey to school and after they get off the vehicle on their way home.

Other information

Provision for pupils with special educational needs

Many children experience a difficulty with learning, or other special educational need, at some point in their school life. It is nearly always possible to provide appropriate help and support within local mainstream schools and it is our policy to do so wherever possible. The standard admission rules will apply.

If you think your child has a special or additional need, you should first talk to his or her class teacher. This may result in a special programme being set up within school or in some cases it may lead to contact with one of our specialist services. All schools have a written policy for responding to special educational needs. This must be in line with the Code of Practice (2001) issued by the Department for Education and Skills and should include details of the ways special needs are assessed and what resources will be used to help pupils with difficulties. A summary of this Code of Practice can be provided on request from the address given at the end of the page.

If neither the school's own resources nor help from our specialist services enable the pupil to make satisfactory progress, it may be necessary, in consultation with parents, to carry out a statutory assessment under the terms of the 1996 Education Act. The need for this assessment will be carefully considered first. The assessment will always involve those with parental responsibility and the pupil's teacher, as well as the educational psychologist and clinical medical officer for the school. Others with information about the pupil's difficulties (for

example specialist teachers, paediatricians or social workers) will also be included in the process if they are involved.

If necessary, a statement of special educational needs will be produced describing the child's special educational needs and how they will be met. The help provided can be in a variety of forms and may include additional specialist teaching and support from a learning support assistant or attendance at a specialist unit attached to a mainstream school.

Some children have special educational needs that are so complex that they are best met in a special school. There are 12 of these schools in Norfolk and, wherever possible, planning and curriculum arrangements are co-ordinated with those of local mainstream schools. Parents are always consulted when a recommendation for a special school place is considered for a child or young person. In a small number of exceptional circumstances, we may recommend a placement at an independent school outside Norfolk.

Assessment and provision team

School catering

How meals are provided

First, infant and primary schools and schools without kitchens

In most of these schools a two-course meal is provided at a fixed price. The menus are varied and designed to appeal to children. You can get a copy of the current menu from the school.

Schools will tell parents of the arrangements for payment of school lunch money but parents usually pay on Monday for the whole week. If a pupil is absent on a day when a lunch has been paid for, the meal will be held in credit until the pupil's return.

First and primary schools with part cash cafeterias

At these schools the main course of the meal is at a set price. Parents usually pay for this first course on Monday for the coming week, with credit for any meal not taken through illness or absence held over until the pupil's return.

Food or drink chosen for the second course is paid for on the day and money for this course must be taken to school daily.

Junior and middle schools

Some junior and middle schools have self-service cafeterias with a wide range of popular dishes. Pupils may choose from a menu of individually priced items which are paid for at the time they are taken. They should therefore take money to school each day.

The menu is on display in school so that pupils can choose what they would like to eat and calculate in advance how much money it will cost them. Copies of menus and price lists are available from the school.

Menus

A wide variety of food, much of it additive free and low in salt and sugar, is provided. The variety of foods available enables pupils to have a balanced meal.

Special diets

Special diets can be provided for medical or religious reasons. If your child requires a special diet, you should give details to the school, including any recommendations. A letter from your child's doctor should accompany any requests for special diets on medical grounds.

Packed lunches

Pupils bringing packed lunches to school are provided with a chair and a table at which to eat their meal. Cutlery and crockery are not provided and therefore children wishing to have a drink should bring their own cups. Drinking water is available.

In the interests of hygiene and safety, parents are asked to co-operate with the school in the provision of packed lunches. Lunches should be packed in leakproof containers. Canned drinks, vacuum flasks and glass bottles should be avoided. Parents are advised that packed lunches are not refrigerated at school.

Free school meals

Children of families receiving Income Support or Income-Based Job Seekers Allowance are entitled to receive free school meals. Families receiving Child Tax Credit, but who are not entitled to a Working Tax Credit, and whose annual income (as assessed by the Inland Revenue) does not exceed £13,230 are also entitled. Documentary evidence of the benefit you are receiving must be provided with the application form which can be obtained from your child's school or direct from the Education Department.

Milk

A third of a pint of milk a day is provided free of charge to pupils attending special schools and to those recommended on medical grounds by the County Council's medical practitioner. Milk is also available at a subsidised price to pupils in most of the county's schools.

Charges for school activities

For some activities, a charge may be made to cover costs in certain circumstances.

These may include:

- music tuition
- cookery and craft activities where ingredients and materials are required
- transport for school visits
- board and lodging on school trips
- entry for examinations for which the

pupil has not been prepared by the school.

If you have difficulty meeting any charges you should discuss the matter in confidence with the headteacher. If you are in receipt of Income Support, Income Based Jobseeker's Allowance, Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, Child Tax Credit, and not entitled to Working Tax Credit and your annual income (as assessed by the Inland revenue) does not exceed £13,230 you may be eligible for remission of board and lodging costs.

Each school is required to have a charging policy. The school's charging policy must be described in its brochure, available from the school. We have adopted a policy which we recommend to school governors but it is for the governors to decide whether or not to follow the policy. Details of our charging policy are available from:

Clothing allowance

For families on very low incomes we provide limited help with the purchase of basic articles of clothing, such as shoes, to enable a child to attend school. Requests for help should be made to your child's school in the first instance. Your enquiry will be dealt with on a confidential basis.

Insurance

We do not hold personal accident insurance cover for voluntary helpers or pupils. Several commercial policies are

available if you wish to get personal accident insurance cover.

A liability insurance policy covers the County Council, its employees and approved voluntary helpers against any claims arising from acts of negligence by the County Council.

Complaints about schools

Concerns and complaints about a school are dealt with by the school. Every school has its own complaints procedure. They will give or send you a copy. The Authority only gets involved if the school has not followed its own procedure correctly. Even then the matter still has to be resolved by the school.
