ACE Achieving great art for everyone consultation – last call for evidence

A reminder to members to respond to Arts Council England's (ACE) consultation report: Achieving great art for everyone – a consultation on future priorities for the arts, the results of which will inform a ten-year strategic framework and ACE's future investment decisions.

The consultation represents the first time the Arts Council has brought together all arts forms and development areas into one set of long-term priorities. The consultation is a very important one, to which the nalgao will be responding to.

The consultation outlines five long-term goals that will drive ACE's development work, inform its funding priorities and strengthen relationships with artists, organisations and audiences. The goals are:

- Talent and artistic excellence are thriving and celebrated
- The arts leadership and workforce are diverse and highly skilled
- More people value and enjoy the arts
- Every child and young person has the opportunity to experience the richness of the arts
- The arts sector is sustainable, resilient and innovative

The consultation also includes proposals on new, more flexible, funding programmes to help deliver these goals. Championing the arts, Alan Davey, Chief Executive of ACE, states, "the arts have flourished in the last 15 years and there is now a genuine acceptance that they are a part of the fabric of the nation. We want to build on that strength to ensure that everyone has the opportunity to access the very best of the arts and that in ten years' time the arts will continue to thrive." ACE has committed to invest £1.3 billion of public money from government and a further £0.3 billion from the National Lottery between 2008 and 2011.

Parks for People (UK)

The Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) has announced that the next closing date for applications to the Parks for People programme is the 31st August 2010. Launched originally as a joint initiative with the Big Lottery Fund full responsibility for the programme has now passed to the Heritage Lottery Fund Local Authorities as well as not for profit organisations that own public parks and gardens can apply for grants of between £250,000 and £5 million for the regeneration of parks and public gardens (including squares, walks and promenades). Applicants will need to raise at least 30 % of the project costs from their own sources and partnership funding, either as cash or non-cash contributions. The 'Parks for People' programme has a two-stage application process. If a Stage One Pass is awarded, applicants can submit a Stage 2 application. Funding for Children's Summer Playschemes (UK)

Ofcom Launches New Bidding Round under its Community Radio Fund (UK)

The Office of Communications (Ofcom) has announced that the next fund round for Community Radio Fund will open for applications on the 14th April and close on the 11th May 2010. The Community Radio Fund has been established to help fund the core costs of running a community radio station. These not-for-profit radio stations have a social purpose, and work to involve their target community in running the service. Under the fund, Community Radio Stations are being invited to apply for funding to support their core running costs. These core costs can include; management; administration; financial management & reporting; fundraising to support the station (grants and commercial funding); community outreach; and volunteer organisation and support. There is no upper limit of grant that can be applied for. Grants can

only be made to community radio licensees ("Licensee") which are broadcasting under a community radio licence (and not an RSL, for example). During the last bidding round 14 Community Radio Stations received grants ranging from £4,940 to £39,667. For more information, visit:

The Woodward Charitable Trust (UK)

New £50 Million Lottery Fund for Scotland (Scotland)

The Big Lottery Fund (BIG) has announced a new £50 million funding programme for Scotland to help transform the life chances of young people leaving care and fundamentally improve the lives of older people with dementia and their carers. The Big Lottery Fund has begun work to develop the way in which these funds will be distributed. BIG seeks to work with a range of key stakeholders, including the Scottish Government, in developing this proposal over the next few months. This follows the announcement in December 2009 that the BIG Lottery Fund will have around £400 million in total to invest in Scotland in the five years from 2010. Plans for the remainder of this investment will be finalised in the coming months, and further announcements on this are planned.
