Dear Teacher,

As you approach the end of the Autumn Term, I would like to draw your attention to January 2010 when I hope you will be interested in taking part in our Free Teachers' Music-Skills Workshop. If you cannot attend but you know of another teacher who may be interested in attending please pass this letter and booking form on to them.

In January, February and March 2010, Norwich Theatre Royal will be working with 3 Schools in Norfolk to produce a show based on themes from Mozart's *The Marriage of Figaro*. As part of this project we will be running a free Teacher's Workshop after school on Monday 18th January 2010. The workshop marks the starting point of our *The Marriage of Figaro* project and is designed to help teachers who may be interested in developing their music-skills, using opera in the classroom or finding out more about Norwich Theatre Royal's work with local schools.

The music-skills workshop will provide you with practical and written material, which can be taken back to school and taught in the classroom. It is designed especially for non-music specialists, and all the work is linked to music in the National Curriculum at Key Stage 2 in relation to Performing, Composing, Listening and Appraising. Whether you are a music specialist or have no experience in these fields, you will find this workshop is perfect for stimulating new ideas for classroom work, not just for music but also for cross-curricular work.


