The good news is that we are offering our much praised programmes at the same cost as last year. We are well aware of the financial constraints that schools are working under but also know the value of high-class CPD at affordable rates. All too often CPD is seen as an easy excision from the budget but we all know that can be a false economy and learning suffers when teaching becomes stale or outmoded.
