Norfolk secures funding to make a significant difference to the quality of our unique programme to allow Teaching Assistants to teach Physical Education in Norfolk Schools.

NPETCS – the Norfolk PE Teaching Competence Standards Programme has gone from strength to strength over the past 5 years. Norfolk was the pioneer of this programme, which is now copied widely across the Country. We are set to once again lead the country with our unique and innovative new programmes, which offer the same robust and rigorous training but to a wider audience. We are working with a key stakeholder to get accreditation for all our programmes and expand and enhance our existing offer to staff in Norfolk schools. The 2010-11 academic year is set to see the following new innovations in the programme:

- New Cover Supervisors Programme this is a specialist course designed to support the workforce development agenda in Secondary schools. 15 Cover Supervisors and other Adults Supporting Learning (ASL) will begin this programme in June 2010. The course will be accredited during this year to give all successful delegates a full Level 3 qualification. The programme will consist of core essential modules dealing with such areas as risk management, assessment and National Curriculum (2007). In additional delegates will complete activity specific modules aimed at both KS3 and 4. Delegates will be signposted to National Governing Body of Sport Awards.
- 2. **Diploma in Primary PE Subject Leadership** this new and unique course is modular based and designed as the next extension from NPETCS. The course will allow NPETCS candidates to operate effectively as the subject leader for their primary phase school. Delegates on this programme will be supported and competent to complete a subject leader SEF and input into the whole school SEF effectively. To enrol in this programme TA's must have successfully completed and gained their Standards through the normal NPETCS route. Accredited as a Diploma at Level 3 this programme requires the completion of four essential modules (full day programme per module) and some self-review tasks. You can see the modules in the diagram later in this Bulletin. This programme starts in December 2010 so book early. Initial interest in this programme has been exceptionally high.
- 3. New Modules for NPETCS a series of new modules have and are being designed to further enhance our highly successful NPETCS programme. These bolt-on modules are set to include Early Years, SEN and will also include access to all the individual Coaching modules which form the Coaching Diploma listed below. These new bolt-on modules are still in the development phase but details will be sent to all schools as soon as they are finalised you can register your interest with us today.
- 4. **Diploma in Sports Coaching** working with our key partner, this Level 3 accredited programme is available for those who want to develop their coaching skills and content. It is ideal for supporting after school clubs, coaching in schools and or club environments. The programme is open to all adults supporting the learning (ASL) in our schools which obviously includes all teaching assistants.

Calling All NPETCS Qualified Staff

We are currently close to ensuring that the NPETCS programme is accredited through the Open College Network. This will mean that all those who have passed the programme can be accredited with a nationally recognised level 3 qualification upon the production of their signed off Standards and portfolio.

This is great news and means that well over 170 Teaching Assistants will be eligible for the Award of a national Level 3 qualification. Please can you complete and return by fax or post the updated contact form at the back of this bulletin so that we can liaise directly with you to ensure that you get your accredited certificate.

It is great to hear of NPETCS delegates being successfully awarded Qualified Teacher Status, or completing and Open University Degree or even having twins! You continue to have such a huge and significant impact in our schools that we need to monitor it. 65% of the schools which achieved the new High Quality PE Chartermark Award all had NPETCS trained staff making a massive contribution to whole school development in and through PE. Other NPETCS trained staff are writing and designing specialist resources for schools, attending additional training and taking more high profile roles within their schools. This us last year to introduce the following award......

Award for NPETCS making the most significant contribution to whole school development through PE - 2010.



This award was launched last year. It seeks to create a higher profile for the outstanding work that NPETCS trained staff achieve by using their skills, knowledge and enthusiasm. Last year Paula Grey from Mundesley First School (left) was successfully nominated by her head teacher and staff colleagues, beating over 85 other nominees for the Award. Paula won a Shield and special certificate as well as a full set of our County PE Sports Kit. Paula's contribution to the school was listed in great detail by her head teacher through the nomination process and the pupils at the school were involved in making a short DVD presentation about her work. Paula's award was part of a high profile celebration of High Quality PE in February, where she received her Award from Councillor Tony Tomkinson, Vice Chairman of Norfolk County Council. New – Most Outstanding Candidate in Cohort Award

This new award, introduced in 2009 seeks to recognise the candidate whom in the tutor team's view has been the most outstanding candidate on the course.

This is often about the quality of the lesson observations, portfolio evidence from their files and commitment during training. Last year Debbie Glover, from Fleggburgh Primary won the Award (see right). Debbie teaches vertically grouped classes in a small rural primary which has to use the local village hall. Debbie's external lesson observations by the team were both graded as Outstanding. Martin Radmore said of the two lessons which he observed *"it was an absolute privilege to watch Debbie teach this group. Despite having pupils from year 3 – year 6 every child was challenged and able to work at a level appropriate to them. They clearly had the skills and confidence to get involved and made fantastic progress as a result of the outstanding teaching they received."*
