Get Set Network awards

East Norfolk Playing for Success Associate Centre - a unique partnership between Cliff Park High School and Norfolk Children's Services has been approved by LOCOG to be the first setting in Norfolk to join the Get Set network. Centre Manager Jo Bivens said, 'We are very proud and excited to receive the right to use the London 2012 education logo and the wealth of opportunities that being part of the Get Set network will create'.

Cliff Park High School – are delighted to announce that they also have been made part of the Get Set network, and together, these two networked centres are going to visit the Olympic Park in London. They have had fantastic support to do this; head teacher Rob Sherington has paid for train tickets, and Richard Grove the Partnership Development Manager donated £100 for tube fares. A whistle-stop tour of London will be included, as many of the children have never left Gt. Yarmouth, let alone been to London before.

1. Jonathan Edwards launches Just Imagine!

The Just Imagine films will be launched by Olympic gold medallist Jonathan Edwards in June. Over 500 pupils and teachers participated in this award winning initiative which used virtual technology and a lot of imagination to 'take Norfolk pupils to the Olympic Games'.

2. Norfolk's Competitive Edge Competitive Edge is the first sports project in the region to receive London 2012's Sports Inspire mark, which was awarded to the Sports Ambassador and STARS schemes. The London Organising Committee for the Olympic Games (LOCOG) recently visited Clenchwarton School to film Competitive Edge students completing the Sports Relief mile. Norfolk's Competition Team

Competition hots up amongst Norfolk's schools as more and more children and young people are taking part in inter-school competitions including tri-golf, gymnastics, tag-rugby, kwik cricket, cross-country and aquathalon (a swim and a run). This year nearly 14,000 young people have taken part across Norfolk's primary, secondary and special schools, assisted by over 700 Youth Leaders, who have officiated and helped, make these competitions possible. Many of the competitions include county finals, with the winning teams from School Sport Partnership events representing their Partnerships, and in many cases hoping to qualify for regional and national finals.

Tour of Britain comes to Norfolk

Children all over Norfolk can experience the thrill of the counties largest ever live sporting spectacle, as the Tour of Britain cycle race heads 117 miles across Norfolk on Thursday September 16. All schools can join in - cycling training and arts workshops are planned for schools across the county and ideas for topic work and activities will be available from June.
