Charging for courses

This year you will notice that a small charge will be made for some courses, the charge is minimal compared to the actual cost so you are still receiving high value training at a small cost to the setting, childminder or school. The payment for training is the responsibility of the setting, so you will need to consider carefully what your training needs are and which practitioners are

Non-attendance and cancellations

If you fail to turn up to a course you have booked on to, you will be charged a fee of **£50**. This is to ensure that places on courses are not wasted.

If you are unable to attend please give us a minimum of 24 hours notice so we are able to reallocate the place without a charge being made to you.

If you give us notice but it is less than 24 hours you will still be charged the cost of the place (e.g. £10 or £20) or an administration cost of £10 for courses that are free.

CIEH level 2 Award in Food Safety in Catering

This course looks at how to comply with the legal requirements for food safety, which require that food handlers have adequate training.

The course covers the CIEH syllabus and includes:

- the causes of food poisoning
- controlling the risks from food hazards
- personal hygiene
- cleaning and disinfection
- design of food premises
- pest control
- basic food safety law

There will be a 30 question multiple choice exam at the end of the course.

Information Sharing and Assessment (ISA) and the Common Assessment Framework (CAF) are key elements of the Every Child Matters agenda, providing a common method of assessment of needs across all services for children and young people aged 0 to 18 and their families.

The ISA team holds a range of free training events, which include:

ISA e-learning module

An online module giving background information on both ISA and the CAF process.

One-day multi-agency ISA and CAF training

This course builds on the e-learning module and will give a good working knowledge of the CAF process. It includes how to decide if a CAF is necessary, how to gain informed consent, how to complete the assessment, who to involve, when to share information and how to plan next steps when forming an action plan. All delegates will be given a comprehensive information pack to take away, plus an opportunity to network with other agencies in your area.

The e-learning module must be completed before attending the one-day ISA training course.

Half-day assessment skills training

This course focuses on useful skills to use during the assessment process, enabling delegates to develop and practise these skills and increase their understanding of the format of the CAF.

The one-day ISA and CAF training must have been completed before attending the half-day Assessment Skills training.

Half-day lead professional training

This course focuses on the skills required for the lead professional role, familiarising delegates with the requirements of the role and gaining knowledge about the skills needed to engage with children, young people and their families, effectively chair or facilitate multi-agency meetings, and complete and renew action plans. The one-day ISA and CAF training must have been completed before attending the half-day lead professional training.
