The Briston and Hunworth Art Trail 2010 (Norfolk Open Studios) 'Nine views of art' May 22nd and June 6th

This year there are six venues and nine established artists on the Briston and Hunworth Art Trail, as part of the Norfolk Open Studios event. They each offer a very different creative perspective, but share a passion for creating art and are happy to talk about their motivation, inspirations and techniques.

Hunworth Village Hall is the venue for four artists: Josie Nudd uses acrylics and mixed media for her textured abstracts and Kate Green paints her storytelling poetic images in watercolour. There are two photographers, but whereas Andy Midgley specialises in light-filled North Norfolk landscapes, David Tipling is an international wildlife photographer focusing on barn owls.

In Briston there are five artists, each in their own studio. Starting in Wellington Road, Nicky Webb at no. 37 produces kiln-formed glass objects by balancing art and science and Trevor Woods at no. 11 paints his instantly recognisable architectural images in acrylic and ink. Down The Lane at the end of Long Yard you will find Colin Bygrave who makes deep and detailed etchings using traditional processes. At the other end of the village, at 167 Hall Street, is HJ Jackson who is best known for his prints of the declining fishing industry. Just round the corner at Hawksbill, Craymere Road, Sandi Westwood paints in oils, inspired by the natural and ethereal world.

The studios are open on various dates between May 22nd and June 6th. Information, including opening times for each studio and maps of the trail, will be available from local venues including the Hunny Bell, Briston village shops and the tourist information office in Holt. Norfolk Open Studios is delivered by Norfolk & Norwich Festival in partnership with Norfolk artists for the benefit of Norfolk artists. Each year for the last 15 years, hundreds of artists scattered across the county have opened up their studios, homes, garden sheds and outhouses to the public to create a unique and personal visual arts event.

The scheme gives the public a chance to meet artists in an informal setting, see and buy or commission artwork and discuss the techniques and processes used to create the work. It gives artists the chance to connect with their audience and in many cases the public can watch as they work in their studio setting. Norfolk Open Studios,has established itself as one of the largest and most successful open studio schemes in the country. In 2009, an estimated 27,400 members of the public roamed the county to visit over 350 participating artists in 253 venues and an estimated total of £221,628 worth of art was sold. Film project for young people in Holt

Teenagers in north Norfolk are invited to take part in a new £21,000 project to make an internet TV show about growing up in a rural area.

Anyone interested in taking part should come along to a taster session at Holt Youth Project on Old Station Way on Friday May 7 from 7pm to 9pm.

This will be an opportunity to meet the tutors, find out more about the project and have a go at using film making equipment. Please book your place in advance on 01603 628367.

The project, called Bus Shelter, is an opportunity for young people aged 13 to 19, to make a series of short films about issues that affect young people growing up in rural Norfolk. These will be used to stimulate discussion on a 'live' TV debate show, featuring key figures from the community such as MPs, teachers and police, which will be planned, presented and filmed by the young people.

Filming will take place at Epic, the former Anglia TV studios in Norwich, and the finished product will be broadcast on the internet.

A 'behind the scenes' documentary style film will be made alongside the project, following the young people's journeys as their ideas are put into action.

Participants will have the opportunity to work towards an Arts Award qualification throughout the project.

Foyle Foundation Schools Library Programme (UK)

State funded secondary and primary schools as well as dedicated schools catering for those with Special Educational Needs (SEN) that do not have or want to improve their libraries can apply for funding through the Foyles Foundation Schools Library Programme. This programme recognises that there is no statutory requirement for schools to have a library and that many school libraries are in a desperate situation through underfunding and underdevelopment. Encouraging children to read widely from an early age will provide a major boost to improving literacy levels, which is a current key educational objective. Priority will be given to funding library books. The Foundation will also consider contributions towards library software, necessary IT equipment and specialist seating/desks. Preference will be given to schools which can clearly demonstrate that their library can be maintained and renewed in the future. The average grant made under this programme is £10,000.

Community Radio Fund (UK)

Ofcom's Community Radio Fund is now open to applications and will close on the 11th May 2010. Under the fund, Community Radio Stations can apply for funding to support their core running costs. These can include:

- Management
- Administration, financial management & reporting costs
- Fundraising to support the station
- Community outreach work
- Costs involved in using volunteers.

There is no upper limit of grant that can be applied for. There is no upper limit of grant that can be applied for, however, the minimum grant is £5,000. Grants can only be made to community radio licensees which are broadcasting under a community radio licence (and not an RSL, for example). Grants for the Arts - Individuals and Organisations (England)

Grants are available to individuals and organisations for up to five years for arts-related activities that take place mainly in England.

- For grants to organisations there is a ceiling of £100,000.
- For grants to individuals there is a ceiling of £30,000.
- For all grants, the minimum application is £1,000.
- For national activities the maximum grant is £200,000

Organisational grants are available to arts organisations; local authorities and other public organisations; partnerships; regional and national organisations; organisations whose normal activity is not arts-related, including voluntary and community groups and groups of organisations (one will need to take the lead and have the main responsibility for managing the application and any grant).

Grants to individuals are available to; artists;' performers; writers; promoters; presenters; curators; producers; groups of individual; and other individuals working in the arts.
